The outcome of this equality impact assessment is that the proposed change to council tax support being considered is neutral in terms of their impact on people with protected characteristics under equalities legislation.

OBJECTIVE

| 1. | What is the main purpose of the project? | The council is considering a change to its council tax support scheme. The scheme offers a means tested reduction in council tax for those on low incomes. |
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| | | The proposal is to reduce the minimum payment for working age claimants of council tax support by 2.5% over two years, so it will reduce by 1.5% in 2020/21 and by a further 1% in 2021/22. |
| | | Practical example: A household of two or more people in a Band A property must pay £1,278.50 in council tax. If the household is on income support and can claim the full amount of council tax support, then the amount they currently pay reduces to £223.74. |
| | | Under the proposal, assuming no change in the full council tax due for Band A properties, by 2021/22 the household will pay 2.5% less i.e., the amount due will go down by £31.96 to £191.78. |
| | | In order to implement the proposal, the cost to the council is estimated to be about £26,000 a year by 2021. However, the cost of this will be met by a Council Tax premium, charged on properties which have been empty long term. |
| 2. | Who are the main stakeholders? | Residents of the borough: council tax payers and council tax support recipients. |

| 3. | How are they expected to benefit? | Low income residents will benefit from a decrease in the amount of council tax they are required to pay. |
