PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

- 19/07/10 a test purchase of 2 pouches of illicit tobacco was made from Drinks Express. A written warning was later sent to Mr Khalid Parvez in relation to this.
- 04/02/11 9 bottles of illegally diverted non-duty paid High Commissioner whiskey and Glen's Vodka were seized from Drinks Express by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs during a joint visit with Lancashire Trading Standards Service.
- 03/10/12 a test purchase was made from Drinks Express of 1 pack of illicit Golden Virginia tobacco.
- 14/02/14 complaint received that Drinks Express is selling illicit tobacco.
- 18/02/14 an officer attempted a test purchase of 'cheap tobacco' but was informed by the shop assistant at Drinks Express that they had just sold out.
- 20/02/14 104 packs of 9 different brands of tobacco/cigarettes were seized, mainly from a hidden compartment in the store room at Drinks Express. All bore incorrect health warnings and were non-duty paid, while 97 of these packs were also counterfeit. A notebook containing lists and values of illicit brands seized was taken from behind the counter.
- 20/02/14 Waqar Mahmood aka Xavier Khalid, the son of licensee Khalid Parvez, assaulted Trading Standards Officer Michael Craig and tried to take a case carrying seized goods off him at Drinks Express. Mr Craig's arm was injured as a result of this assault. Trading Standards Officers managed to exit the shop and call the police, who arrested Xavier Khalid.
- 08/12/2016 Prosecution of Waqar Mahmood aka Xavier Khalid for assaulting a Trading Standards Officer, Michael Craig, at Drinks Express.
 - 08/12/16 Prosecution of Waqar Mahmood aka Xavier Khalid for possession for supply of tobacco products seized from Drinks Express on 20th February 2014.
 - Waqar Mahmood aka Xavier Khalid was convicted of both offences, fined £600 and was ordered to pay £3300 costs.
- 11/05/17 test purchase of 1 pack of illicit President cigarettes made from Drinks Express. These cigarettes did not contain compliant health warnings.
- 03/06/17 test purchase of 1 pack of illicit Paradox cigarettes from Drinks Express.
 These cigarettes did not contain compliant health warnings.
- 20/06/17 test purchase of 1 pack of illicit Paradox cigarettes from Drinks Express.
 These cigarettes did not contain compliant health warnings.
- 10/07/17 37 packets of counterfeit / non-duty paid cigarettes and tobacco and 4 bottles of counterfeit Smirnoff vodka were seized from Drinks Express. The cigarettes were hidden in the rear stockroom, whilst the vodka was discovered behind the counter. Trading Standards prosecutors are currently preparing prosecution files in relation to these new offences at Drinks Express.

Relevant Information

- Supplying (including possessing for supply) tobacco products that do not display compliant health warnings is an offence, contrary to the Tobacco and Related Products Regulations 2016;
- Supplying (including possessing for supply) tobacco products bearing trademarks without the consent of the proprietor of the mark is an offence contrary to the Trade Marks Act 1994.
- The sale of smuggled tobacco products is an offence contrary to the Tobacco Products Duty Act 1979.
- Knowingly acquiring, harbouring keeping or concealing non-duty paid alcohol is an offence contrary to the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979.

Paragraphs 11.27 & 11.28 of 'The Revised Guidance issued under Section 182 of The Licensing Act 2003' (Home Office April 2017) states that:

There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises that should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of the licensed premises

... for the sale or storage of smuggled alcohol and tobacco.

It is envisaged that licensing authorities, the police, the Home Office (Immigration Enforcement) and other law enforcement agencies, which are responsible authorities, will use the review procedures effectively to deter such activities and crime. Where reviews arise and the licensing authority determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined through the premises being used to further crimes, it is expected that revocation of the licence — even in the first instance — should be seriously considered.

The following options are available to the committee:-

- 1) Do nothing However the sheer number and seriousness of the offences causes grave concern for no action.
- 2) Modify the conditions of the licence
- 3) Remove the Designated Premises Supervisor
- 4) Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
- 5) Revoke the premises licence so that no alcohol can be sold at all.

In the opinion of Lancashire County Council Trading Standards Service, the information presented in the application is clear evidence that the Prevention of Crime and Disorder Licensing Objective has been flagrantly and systematically disregarded. Despite repeated enforcement action, over a period of seven years, the sale of illicit tobacco has continued at the premises.

Lancashire County Council Trading Standards respectfully requests that the committee considers whether revocation of the premises licence would be an appropriate finding in the circumstances.
